Sites within Shoreland of the Upper & Lower West Fork Des Moines River. Jackson County estimated to conduct one inspection for this strategy. This goal was met.

Sites that have never been inspected, or not inspected in the last 8 years and are in the Upper & Lower West Fork Des Moines River. Jackson County estimated to conduct 2 inspections for this strategy. This goal was met. Jackson County conducted 4 inspections in this category.

Sites that, according to previous inspections, have not maintained adequate land application records and/or manure management plans. Jackson County estimated to conduct 2 inspections for this strategy. This goal was met. Jackson County conducted 3 inspections in this category.

Conduct phosphorus inspection within the Little Sioux Watershed. Jackson County estimated to conduct 15 inspections for this strategy. This goal was met. Jackson County did 19 compliance inspections along with phosphorus inspections. Upon inspection, 2 of the 19 sites were found to be under the 300 animal units and re-registered their sites to reflect that change.

On March 2, 2023, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) completed a year-end review of the Jackson County (County) delegated feedlot program for the period of January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022. Based upon the review, the MPCA has determined that the County satisfactorily met 16 out of an applicable 16 or 100 percent of non-inspection minimum program requirements (MPRs). The County also satisfactorily conducted 27 inspections of the 317 feedlots required to be registered for an inspection rate of 8.5 percent.

In addition, the MPCA has reviewed the County's 2022-2023 Delegation Agreement and Work Plan by comparing it to the work the county has done.

No modifications to the Delegation Agreement Work Plan have been proposed at this time.
